H. L. B. No. 18-54

To re-appropriate the fund balance amount of \$5,050.00 under Saipan Local Law No. 17-18 specifically described under Business Unit 3752J for the Dandan Children' Park; and for other purposes. Introduced by REP. ANTONIO P. SABLAN of Saipan, Precinct 1 (*for himself*) on May 5, 2014.

H. L. B. No. 18-55

To amend the Saipan Zoning Law of 2013, 10 CMC § 3511 to include funeral homes as a conditional use in Village Commercial Zoning Districts. Introduced by REP. RAMON A. TEBUTEB of Saipan, Precinct 3 (*By Request*) on May 5, 2014.

THIRD LEGISLATIVE DAY:

To amend the contribution formula to cover the liabilities of the central government and autonomous agencies to reflect their liability for retirement benefits. Introduced by REP. MARIANO TAITANO of Saipan, Precinct 1 (*for himself*) on May 5, 2014, referred to the Special Committee on Retirement.

H. B. No. 18-185

To require all tour companies and agents to register and be issued a permit by the Commonwealth Ports Authority (CPA); and for other purposes. Introduced by REP. ANTONIO P. SABLAN of Saipan, Precinct 1 (*for himself*) on May 5, 2014, referred to the Committee on Commerce.

H. B. No. 18-186

To allow the Department of Public Lands (DPL) to grant revocable consent without fees to individuals, businesses, or organizations to construct and maintain certain structures on public property such as driveways and sidewalks; and for other purposes. Introduced by REP. ANTONIO P. SABLAN of Saipan, Precinct 1 (*for himself*, Representative Mariano Taitano) on May 5, 2014, referred to the Committee on Natural Resources.

H. B. No. 18-187

To amend 6 CMC §3156(b), as enacted by Public Law No. 18-30, the Tourism Entertainment and Destination Enhancement Act of 2013, to allow existing gaming entertainment establishments in the Garapan Core Zone, to operate non-poker electronic gaming devices. Introduced by REP. LORENZO I. DELEON GUERRERO of Saipan, Precinct 5 (*for himself*) on May 5, 2014, referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

H. B. No. 18-188

To allow all-terrain vehicles to be operated on public road in the Commonwealth. Introduced by REP. CHRISTOPHER D. LEON GUERRERO of Saipan, Precinct 4 (*for himself*) on May 5, 2014, referred to the Committee on Judiciary and Governmental Operations.

H. B. No. 18-189

To require all vehicles belonging to tour companies to be register with the Department of Commerce and be issued a permit number for each vehicle; and for other purposes. Introduced by REP.
